

Minutes of AGM of Kentish Town Neighbourhood Forum (KTNF)

Chair's Welcome and Report

The Chair of KTNF welcomed everyone to the third AGM of KTNF and reported on a busy 12 months including our formal designation by Camden Council as a Neighbourhood Forum and of the KTNF area.

Six Working Parties have started work to work on draft NP policies. They cover: Working & Shopping; Planning & Design; Housing; Getting Around; Green & Open Spaces; Community, Social & Culture.

Throughout the year KTNF has worked with Creative Citizens to develop an online Neighbourhood Plan.

On 7 December 2013 we organised an exhibition of draft policies and a public meeting at St Benet's which was attended by over 130 people.

The year ahead will be even busier as we work to deliver our Neighbourhood Plan ready for a referendum later in 2014.
